1. All general rules apply.
2. Steers/Heifers must be owned and entered with 4-H/FFA by March 26, 2022
3. All steers/heifers must participate in an official validation site and be KUIP tagged. Must have Health Papers for show/sale.
4. To be eligible for rate of gain, animal must be weighed at an official validation site for initial weights and reported to the 4-H agent/FFA advisor.
5. All animals must be dehorned and properly castrated by weigh-in.
6. Steer/heifer must be born after January 1, 2022.
7. All market steers/heifers are required to

have necktie along with halter when unattended.

8. Market steers/heifers must be at official weigh-out from 3:30 p.m.-5:00 p.m.

Wednesday, July 27, 2022.

9. All steers/heifers must weigh a minimum of 950 lbs. at the official weigh-out to qualify for sale. Any animal not making the minimum weight requirement on the first weigh-out can take the animal off the scale and re-enter the scales for a second weigh-out. Animals may NOT leave the scale area before second weigh-out.

10. Feeder calves must be a steer or heifer. Born after January 1, 2022. Maximum weight 850 pounds.
